Jesus, Our Refuge and Firm Foundation

National Conference is fast approaching and our theme this year is “Focused on Jesus, Our Refuge and Firm Foundation”. In light of that theme, I was reading Psalm 46 the other day and rediscovered that this passage is amazingly contemporary and up to date. In case you haven’t noticed, our world is being bombarded by all kinds of troubles and crises. Not a day goes by without a news report of either a natural disaster or international conflict. Yet, the Psalmist begins by declaring, *“God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.”*



Events such as the recent earthquake and tsunami in Japan coupled with the potential nuclear facility meltdown in that country create fear and great anxiety. Equally disconcerting and disquieting is the unrest impacting the Middle East and Northern Africa in such nations as Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Bahrain, and Yemen. But the Psalmist provides us with words of encouragement and reassurance in these times of crisis. As a result of God being our refuge and strength, he writes, *“Therefore we will not fear, though the earth gives way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging.”* The Psalmist’s knowledge of the Lord and confidence in His overcoming power enable him to move fearlessly beyond the circumstances of the moment to the safety of the Lord’s provision and protection. He writes, *“There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day. Nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall; He lifts His voice, the earth melts.”*

We have lived through days of difficulty and trouble and we are living in days of crisis. But as we set our focus on what lies ahead, let us keep our eyes on Jesus, our refuge and firm foundation. Our antidote to our world’s current climate of fearfulness is our calm reassurance and confident witness that, *“The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.”*

Beginning **January 1, 2012 the “Spend-A-Day” program will become “Missionary Prayer Partners.”** The concept of connecting individuals and missionaries to mutually pray for each other on a specific date will remain the same but we will initiate a few changes to make this important ministry more accessible and user-friendly.

- Coordination of the Missionary Prayer Partners will be from the GMC office (Carla Sizemore).
- You will be able to select from the participating missionaries, available months and download the needed information from the GMC website or by calling the GMC office.
- We will no longer collect \$1.00 donation with each participant’s prayer slip.
- An informational/instructional brochure and DVD will be produced to guide interested participants through the new Missionary Prayer Partners program.

We want to thank Cathy Jo Bast for her work as Spend-A-Day Coordinator over the years! Cathy Jo will be stepping down as Coordinator at this year’s National Conference so by July 1, 2011 the remaining months of the original 2011 Spend-A-Day program will be handled by Carla Sizemore at the GMC office. We will do our best to navigate this transition smoothly but please do not hesitate to contact Carla with any questions or concerns. Our ultimate goal is to have even more of our members partnering in prayer with our EC missionaries!

The Mission Minded Kids Rally for Delaware & Susquehanna Region was a huge success, with one of the highest attendances in recent history. Trinity E.C. Church in Boyertown hosted 108 children, plus dozens of



helpers, workers, and MMK leaders on March 5th. The theme was "Tell Me the Story of Jesus", and the children learned how it's done in various places of the world: missionaries Brad and Maxine Waldman shared how they teach the Gospel message in the Caribbean;



Jane Heck taught the children in Spanish and English using her experiences in Colombia, Peru and Belize; missionary candidates Dan and Melinda Moury shared how the Message is being told using multi-media; there was exotic food tasting, and a room

where the children could see how many languages already have Jesus' story in print, and how many more there are that need to hear the story. GMC Director Rev. Randy Sizemore used a hand illustration to teach the children the names of our international EC Churches: Japan, Costa Rica, India & Nepal, Mexico and Liberia = **J**esus **C**hrist **I**n **M**ore **L**ives. There were games, prizes, and more food. Most importantly, a seed was planted in the next generation of missionaries and mission leaders, as these children were taught how to share a simple Gospel message with others.
