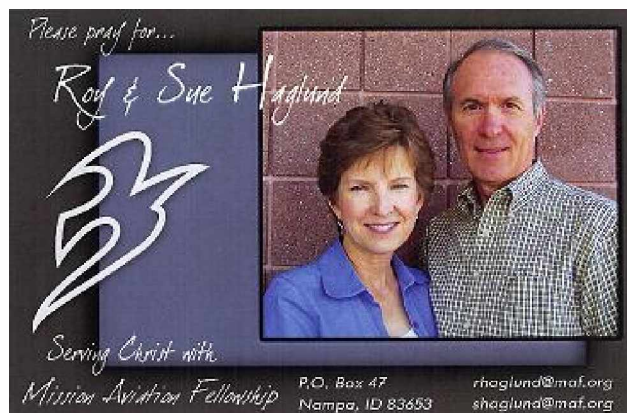

Sue says "At the age of four I accepted Jesus into my heart and life. At 15 I rededicated my life to Him and received complete assurance of salvation." Her favorite Bible verses are Proverbs 3:5-6. Roy committed his life to the Lord at age 14 at Rock River Bible Camp. He states "At that same age I felt that the Lord wanted me in full-time mission service." Sue was led to be a missionary through Roy.

Roy attended Huntington College (2 years), Trinity College (2 years) and Moody Bible Institute (3 years). Sue took four years of liberal arts (majoring in Home Economics) at the University of Minnesota. She took some general courses at Trinity and that's where she and Roy met through Roy's roommate.

Sue is the oldest of four children (two boys & two girls). Both her parents were Christians so she had a good, positive family life. Now she and Roy have been blessed with an adopted daughter from Guatemala, Sarah Joy, who was born December 6, 1979. Bethany, their second daughter was born in Tegucigalpa, Honduras on October 29, 1987.

During the nine years they spent in Central America, Roy flew single engine Cessnas and Sue was a housewife, radio operator, and had a personal ministry through a Bible Study for Latin women in their home in Guatemala. She did, and does enjoy opening their home to people. They are now working in the Nampa, Idaho office.

They went back to Honduras in 1986 and returned to the U.S. in 1989. In addition to flying, Roy was MAF's Honduras Program Manager (Field Director in some missions), overseeing nine other staff and seven aircraft on three bases. After a 6 month stint in Zambia, the Haglunds

returned to the U.S. in 1995 where Roy is now the cash manager for MAF. Sue works part-time as a Ministry Partnership Counselor.

Roy says Third world country economics are going through some really tough times right now with devaluation currencies and shortages of many things, making the running of a flight program quite a challenge. Roy enjoys his ride to the office with Sue through the countryside where they begin their day at 8:00 am with chapel two days a week. The rest of his day is spent primarily at this desk responding to people, corresponding, managing the payroll clerk, processing non-cash gifts and foreign currency checks, budgeting, etc.

When they have time to relax and enjoy hobbies, they both like to read. Roy also enjoys his coin collection and sports. Sue likes to sew, and likes music. They enjoy biking together.

They are also active in their local church (Boise Vineyard) serving on the greeting team and leading a home group. They want to be open to what the Lord would have them do. Roy says they have no definite direction now. Perhaps another overseas assignment is in the future.

MAF moved to Idaho in 2006. The new office facility is in Nampa, which is about 20 miles west of Boise, a fast growing metropolitan area of nearly a half million. It's very dry, averaging about 12 inches of rain a year. The summer is short but hot, approaching 100 degrees frequently. The lifestyle is more relaxed than southern California where they lived before.
