



Jim Ehrman is the Executive Director of the Rivendell Institute at Yale, a research center dedicated to “exploring the intersection of Christian faith and contemporary scholarship.” Before joining the Rivendell Institute, he served as the Executive Director of the World Christianity Initiative at Yale University. In that role he aided both Yale University and the Western Church at-large in its engagement with the explosive growth of the worldwide Church. Inspiration for that focus stemmed from his years spent as a commissioned missionary and later as Director of Global Ministries for the Evangelical Congregational Church. He has also served since 2006 as Affiliate Professor of Global and Contextual Studies at Evangelical Seminary in Myerstown, Pa.

Jim lives in New Haven, Connecticut with his two children and his wife Aiyana. In 2006, Aiyana started a relief and development organization, *Imagine Goods*, which works in Cambodia offering micro-business opportunities to the poorest of the poor. She co-directs that work with Michelle Kime, wife of Joel Kime, pastor of Faith Evangelical Congregational Church in Lancaster, Pa.
